We are all finding it hard to believe that we are approaching the end of another year! The last few months really have flown by and now we are already planning all of our Christmas activities and family support.

We are very grateful to everybody who contributed to Harvest Festival collections, which brought our foodbank levels up to a satisfactory level after months of low stock. The food deliveries are so appreciated by our families who are continuing to find basic household essentials hard to afford. Over the last few weeks since schools returned for the new term we have again been inundated with new referrals. Many more of our families are now coming to us as victims of domestic abuse, which necessitates incredibly sensitive and difficult conversations, so please do keep all of these parents in your thoughts.

We have been encouraged recently by many fundraising events being carried out all over Sussex for us, including collections at bonfire nights and joint initiatives with other local groups such as Rotary clubs.
