Renewal of Parish Electoral Roll

Are you **on** the current roll? You need to complete an application form.

Not on the roll? You need to complete an application form.

"What is the Electoral Roll?" It is the parish's register of electors. In the same way that being on the civic Electoral Roll allows you to vote in parliamentary and local elections and referenda, joining the Church Electoral Roll means that you can vote on Church matters, attend the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) and stand for election to the PCC. The number on the Electoral Roll also determines the maximum number of PCC members and Deanery Synod representatives we may have. If the Roll is not representative of the church membership, this means that the PCC is too small for the workload involved, putting heavy strain on the members.

"Who can be on the Electoral Roll?" To apply for the Electoral Roll you must meet ALL the following conditions:

- You must be aged 16 or over (though you can apply in the year you become 16 and your name will be entered once your birth date has passed).
- · You must be baptised.
- You must be a member of the Church of England and EITHER live in the parish OR have attended a church in the parish regularly for at least 6 months.
- You must complete an Application Form.

The Electoral Roll is Revised every year and totally Renewed every six years.

This year, 2025, the roll is being RENEWED.

The renewal of the Roll ends on **20th April 2025**. Application Forms are available in both our churches and must be returned by **20th April** if you wish to attend and vote at the Annual Meeting on 21st May.

If you are not currently on the Electoral Roll of the parish, please give it some thought and if you wish to join, please complete and return an application form by **20th April**.

If you are already on the Roll, as the roll is being renewed, you <u>MUST</u> complete an Application Form and return it by **20th April** if you wish to remain on the Roll.

Annual Meetings

Our Annual Meetings will be held on Wednesday 21st May. Full details will be given later but it is not too early to remind you to give thought and prayer as to who you may consider to nominate for election to one or more of the following posts:-

Churchwarden - 2 posts.

Deputy Warden - 2 posts.

Deanery Synod Representative - 3 posts.

Parish PCC representative - 1; St John's PCC representative - 2; St Peter & St Paul PCC representative - 1

All the above are members of the Parochial Church Council (PCC). The PCC is responsible for the overall wellbeing, practical as well as spiritual, of the church, the church members and the church buildings. The PCC also has a duty to promote the mission of the church within the wider community. As the PCC is a charity, all members are also charity trustees.

With a full complement of members the Council can more effectively carry out its responsibilities. Please give thought and prayer as to possible future members.

Family Support Work

Extract from recent newsletter from Family Support Team *Dear Friends*.

The recent weeks have seen successful appointment to 3 posts here at FSW. We are delighted to have recruited a new practitioner for Hastings; a new volunteer and engagement co-ordinator for East Sussex; and a digital fundraising and communications officer. We will be sharing more details about these appointments in due course, but are delighted to have been able to strengthen the team. With secondary school places having recently been allocated, many of our families are disappointed at not securing their preferred choice. This is particularly the case for children with SEN (which is a significant percentage of the young people we support), and there is a lot of worry about the future. Practitioners are supporting where they can in investigating whether or not an appeal is appropriate, and if not, giving emotional support around coming to terms with the disappointment and putting strategies in place for a successful transition.

We are now really full into our events schedule, with the first Open Gardens of the year taking place at a new venue for us – The Old Rectory at Warbleton. All of our Open Garden dates are listed on our website so do take the chance to visit one near you if you can. We are also still busily planning our Cuckmere Valley sponsored walk on May 15th, so if you haven't yet registered then please contact Jason in the fundraising team for further information <a href="mailto:isanow.isan

SUPPORTING THE WORLDWIDE PERSECUTED CHURCH IN PRAYER



Three Iranian Christian converts have been sentenced to a combined total of over 40 years in prison. Nargas age 37, pregnant with her first child, has been sentenced to 16 years, Abbas, age 48, 15 years and Mehran, age 37, 10 years. They also received fines. Their punishments are mainly for house church involvement and reflects an increasing crackdown by the Iranian authorities on converts. Please pray for their protection, their health, including that of Nargas' unborn child, and that the Holy Spirit will strengthen them in their faith despite the harsh prison conditions they will face. Please pray too for wisdom for underground churches in the face of this latest bout of persecution.

Sasha became a Christian in Bangladesh when she was twelve, when she, her mum and aunt experienced miraculous healings. She kept her faith in Jesus secret from her Hindu father, but, at the age of 18 he discovered her copy of the gospels and started beating her then forced her to burn the gospels. She cried and begged against this but eventually had to comply. He continued beating her only stopping on the instruction that if he saw her near a church he would kill her. In her culture, Sasha is expected to be obedient to her father. As a young woman she is vulnerable and scared. Despite these risks, she still meets secretly with other Christian girls to pray and read the Bible in her own language. Please pray for Sasha and many other girls like her who are in fear yet maintain their belief in Jesus. Pray for fathers like Sasha's to learn to love their child in the choices they make. Amen
